#### **Growing Hope**

The Growing Hope project promotes community well-being by fostering the development of a sustainable food system in Norte del Cauca, Colombia. In this edition of the newsletter, we highlight the work carried out in two educational institutions: Escuela Primaria Mixta in Mingo and the Bahá'í Ruhi Arbab School in Puerto Tejada. At these schools, students, teachers, and parents have received training on healthy eating and well-being within the educational environment. Additionally, teachers have been trained in the use of action-research materials designed by FUNDAEC, allowing them to conduct their own classroom research. As a result, these initiatives have led to the design and creation of school gardens, as well as government funding to support and sustain their efforts.

Significant progress has been made through various activities, including the establishment of a Diversified High-Efficiency Plot (DHE), where crops such as pumpkin, cilantro, cucumber, beans, and cassava have been successfully harvested. Additionally, productive projects related to animal husbandry—such as raising chickens, pigs, and laying hens—have been implemented, with some of these products now being incorporated into the school store's offerings.

FUNDAEC has also supported the school store by providing supplies and organizing the physical space. Currently, the store offers natural juices, pumpkin cakes, beans, rice, salad, chicken rice, and natural yogurt, while eliminating the sale of sodas and packaged products. These collaborative efforts have had a significant impact on the educational community, increasing awareness among students, teachers, and families about the importance of healthy eating and encouraging them to translate this knowledge into concrete actions that improve both their nutrition and overall quality of life.

#### Visit to Unity Foundation – Luxembourg

In December 2024, FUNDAEC visited the Unity Foundation (UF) in Luxembourg to share experiences and strengthen partnerships. The visit allowed discussions on the expansion of the Preparation for Social Action (PSA) Program to international contexts, especially in Africa, thanks to collaboration with local organizations supported by UF.

Activities during the week included a visit to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Luxembourg, meetings with schools and teachers working with UF, and recording an interview for the upcoming podcast **Actors of Change** on @radioara. The week concluded with an event organized by UF with some of its friends and collaborators at their offices, where further discussions were held about FUNDAEC's programs and their impact.
